Bilingualism

What is bilingualism? People use the term "bilingualism" in different ways. For some, it means an equal ability to communicate in two languages. For others, it simply means the ability to communicate in two languages but with greater skills in one language. In fact, it is more common for bilingual people, even those who have been bilingual since birth, to be somewhat "dominant" in one language.

American Speech-Language-Hearing Association defines bilingualism as the use of at least two languages by an individual. Bilingualism is mostly divided into two types: 1) Simultaneous bilingualism, which occurs when a child is exposed to two languages from birth; and 2) Sequential bilingualism, which occurs when a child has been exposed to a second language, usually after the age of 3 and

after the first language is well established.

We can look at the bilingualism also from different perspective and that is according to the environment where is the second (third) language acquired. One type is called primary bilingualism which occurs when a kid acquires one language from one parent and the second language from the second parent or from environment. It is important to know that those languages are parents' mother tongues. Second type which is mostly seen in our kindergarten, called secondary bilingualism, is when a child learns the second language only in the school or kindergarten. The special subtype is called intentional bilingualism that stands for learning the second language from somebody (it can be a teacher or a parent) whose primary language is different than the language they teach. For example this is the case when mommy's mother tongue is Slovak language but she decides to teach her child English and she communicates only in English with him or her.

It is good to know that there are four stages of acquiring second language in the case of sequential bilingualism. For the first stage is typical that child has minimal comprehension of secondary language, does not verbalize in second language, mostly nods "Yes" and "No.", points and uses his primary language or mother tongue. This stage takes sometimes months till child finds out, that he/she needs to learn the second language. The second stage presents nonverbal period when child starts to understand the simple instructions but does not use any language or produces only one or two responses. For the third stage it is typical that child starts to use familiar phrases and simple sentences. They have still limited but better comprehension. In the last stage, the child can effectively use the second language although it is still not fluent. He/She is able to produce complex sentences, but makes grammar and pronunciation errors. After the last period it takes a long time until the child improves his/her language well enough to acquire fluency level of commu-
