

Our Y1 classes even visited the traffic playground where they trained to ride and drive and follow the traffic rules... Let's check what they have learnt.





### WE SPY... HOW TO STAY SAFE ON THE STREETS?

And how to handle all the city traps and dangers? This was the question for our children. We wanted to find out what the kids in our kindergarten know about traffic and road signs... and honestly, we got positively surprised :)

Do you remember this trip? Yes Do you remember what were you doing there? We were doing something, they were learning us the .... značky. The road signs? Yes. Did you learn anything there? Yes. What? Like that when is green so you can go, when is orange you need to be ready and when is red so you need to stop. Did you learn any road signs? Yes. Do you know what stop sign looks like? What colour is it? Red or blue. So red or blue? Red. What is written inside? Stop. Did you enjoy this trip? Yes. Did you ride any vehicle? Bicycle. Are you able to ride by yourself? Yes, even without the pomocné kolieska. Do you go to ride the bicycle often? Yes. Even on the road? Not on the road, but on the pavement. On the chodník I mean.

Do you remember this trip? Yes. Where was it? In traffic playground. What are you riding? On bicycle. It doesn't have the pedals, isn't it scooter? The scooter. Did you learn there anything? That if it is red you need to

stop. What needs to be red? The traffic light. And what if the light is green? You need to go. And the orange one? That you need to be ready. What are the lines on the road? That that one is going there and the other one is going back :) Did you learn anything about road signs? For example this one O. That, it's not going there. What does this one mean  $\nabla$ Be careful. And what does this mean, this green man ? That not cars but that mens or girls can go, but cars can stop.



Where was the picture taken? | don't know. Where were you? Traffic playground. Do you remember what were you doing there? We needed to go only on this side not on that side. What were you driving? I don't know how to say it in English. Tell me what you call it in Spanish. Patinete. Did you learn there something? I don't know, because it was in Slovak, And you didn't understand? No, but Ms. Lucia was telling us in English what they say.





What was this trip about? When you driving the car in the streets. What did you learn there? About cars. What about them? That they drive. What else did you learn? About don't cross the road when cars are coming. Did you learn anything about the traffic light? Once I accidently drive through and it was red, but luckily I went on fast and the train didn't get me. Is it safe to cross the road when red light is on? No. What does the red light mean? Do not go What does green light mean? Go. And the orange one? Get ready. Did you learn anything about the road signs? Yes, I know three of signs. One is parking, one means stop and one means there is a crossing nearby and there is a picture of the crossing, that means there is crossing. What is the shape of the crossing one? A triangle. The picture is the person crossing the road. What about the parking sign? Parking sign? Square. What about its colour? Blue. What is in the middle? A "P". What does the stop sign look like? Red with stop in the middle.



What was this trip about? About some traffic lights and how we will drive and when we can go and signs and what pictures are there and what they mean ... Why did you learn all of this? Because we are the big ones and in the school we also will talk about something like this and we have to know it. So, what is the traffic light? Traffic light is on big stick, not a wooden stick, and the highest light is red and on red you can't go because you can crash. On orange, in the middle, it means you have to prepare yourself. And the last one, the green one, it means that you can go. Are the traffic lights the same for cars and people? It's some different because people have only red and green because people don't have engine, so they don't need to prepare yourself. Why do we have all the signs on the road? Because signs are telling you something like that you need to stop, you have to look that somebody is not going from somewhere... When there is not the sign and you will not look and you will do whatever you want on the road, you can crash. Even Did you drive any vehicle? Yes, I drived bicycle and scooter. What did you have on your head? Prilba... helmet... Why do you need to have a helmet? Because when you crash to some rock so you can break your head or you can have there blood and when you have helmet, you crash on your helmet. And helmet will not break... What do we have in the car instead? Nothing because when you crash there will be a big balloon... ...ok but you also need to... buckle yourself and the seatbelt when you are going very fast and you

are almost hitting yourself, the seatbelt stuck itself and it will pull you back.

Do you remember this trip? Yeah Where have you been? In some place where we were learning when we can go and when should we stop. And when should you stop? When there is red light. Where? On the traffic light. What else did you learn there? When the cars are going so the people can't go becuase the cars will bump to the people. It's really dangerous, right? Yes, and you can even die. What do we have to do when we want to cross the street? We have to check when is going red light and when is green light for people, they can go, and when is green light for cars, they can go, the cars can go. All right. But what about when there is no traffic light. What should we do then? Then... we should check for the people and when there are no people the cars can go and when there is no cars, the people can go. Did you drive any vehicle? Yes, I was. First I was at scooter and then on bicycle. Did you learn any other signs? Yes. Which one? One there is... They did show us even.... when there is a traffic light and you are so much waiting, so there is a button sometimes, and when you press on it, it will go sooner green. Any other? No. But I know what means number 10. That means that you should go slowly. And when there is square or rectangle and there is "P" so it means you can park over there.

### **ADVISORY...** WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT DUMMY

Sucking is a natural process. Sucking provides child with nutriments for appropriate growth and development. Simply said, it is the reflex essential for survival. For some kids, the pacifier may serve as a so-called transitional object. It relieves stress and helps to adjust to new or challenging situations (e.g. like starting day-care or taking a long car ride). Sucking on a pacifier may be beneficial also because it's linked to a lower risk of sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), although it's not clear why. However, this reflex disappears up to the age of two and after this age it's becoming just a habit. Speach-language pathologists recommend quitting pacifier at approximately 1 year of age. There are two main reasons for this. Firstly, pacifier may decrease the likelihood of your child babbling or speaking and, even if he or she attempts to babble while sucking a pacifier, your child's speech will be distorted. Secondly, the pacifier impedes normal development of tongue and lip muscles and movements due to the unnatural position imposed on these structures by the presence of the pacifier. In addition, the pacifier may be a risk fac-



tor in the development of dental problems and the ear infections. All in all, it is each parent's personal decision whether or not to allow pacifier use. If used appropriately, pacifiers are not likely to impede speech and language development. However, if pacifiers are overused (e.g. child sucks on pacifier too much) or misused (e.g. not appropriately cleaned or sized), they can increase your child's risk of speech and language difficulties. There are two main ways, how to get rid of the pacifier: gradually or promptly/directly. Many parents find it easier to start by limiting daytime use, then work their way up to phasing it out of the night-time routine. Others recommend making a ceremony with the child and get rid of the dummy directly. To some children it takes a time to get used to a new situation, the others take it easy. Once you decide this is the best time for quitting, don't give up!
