


Itay (Donkeys): I did go to Israel and my mommy and daddy be home and my grandma was in Israel with me and then my Daddy did come to take me to Slovakia.




Stelka (Zebras): I was in Kréta and the most nicest pool was the cold one.




Markus (Zebras): I was in Pribeta and I did build there a church.

Ninka G. (Donkeys): I stayed at home. And I go camping. I did play with my daddy, and I did sleep outside.





Isabella (Dragonflies): I've been to Spain and there was the sea and the best ice cream.





MAJKA K.: Food, blanket friends and a bottle of wine.




JUDE: Cola, candy, cookies.

Football I like and I want to be football guy because sometimes one guy did come football guy and he give me my ball so I like football guys.




Stellka (Zebras):

I am good at sport judo, because it's good one. I like that it's fight.


TENNIS COURSE

Children love animals and that's why the Pet Day was one of the most exciting events of our summer-time. Another reason we talked about our pets is that they usually become the kids' best pals. The weather that day was amazing, warm and sunny so we took blankets outside and made ourselves comfortable while watching this amazing performance. At Uprkova we were joined by Alicka's mum and their dog and they told us lots of interesting information about their shared living. Filipko, too, took this event seriously and he introduced us to his turtle Žofka (who is a boy, actually! 😊). Nikolajko's birds in a cage were beautiful and he told us that they usually fly freely in their house. And Livia's „walking sticks“ surprised us all. We don't think anyone has seen such a pet before... At Gajova we were not less surprised by our visitors. We welcomed three dogs – a huge one (owned by Ernes and Vicente), a middle-sized one (owned by Hanka) and a little one (owned by Nikolka and Šimonko). All three of them were very well behaved and much admired by all the kids. Ninka P. showed us her turtle Perlička and her food (the kids didn't enjoy this part – especially the smell 😊). And Alexko's grandma brought a ball python and a coati from the ZOO. Well, those might not be the perfect pets but we were very happy to be able to learn something about them and to touch them. ADVISORY... GETTING A PET

Probably all of parents experience their children begging for a pet sooner or later. And most probably you know yourselves what's the best for your family, but for those who might be kind of doubtful considering pros and cons of the choice "to have or not to have" we bring some useful information. Not only the pets are source of warm, fuzzy entertainment, they can offer several developmental benefits to children, too. A child's physical, social, emotional and cognitive development can all be encouraged by interaction with a family pet.

Physical

Regular activities connected with a pet's life can provide exercise in motor skills. Walking a dog, running, throwing a ball are great ways for children to get away from sedentary indoor activities and move around. Plus, allowing a child to scoop food and pour water into dishes are natural ways of encouraging fine motor skills and body coordination. Of course, parental supervision is always recommended.

Social

Probably the most noticeable benefit of taking care of the pet is that the child learns there is world outside of him-/herself and his/her own needs. Kids who have pets are reported to be less self-centred. They build a safe relationship with a living creature which both teaches them to care and offer unconditional love. For kids that are less socially outgoing, the pet can also be a bridge to potential playmates.

Emotional

Pets can help to build self-esteem in the child as he/she matures and thus can take on more of the care for pet. Pets also facilitate learning of responsibility. It is necessary to point out however, that it's parents who teaches children to be responsible and it is crucial to keep pet-oriented tasks age-appropriate (for both animal's and child's safety). E.g. it is completely fine to let three-year-old fill the food bowls but you wouldn't walk him/her a dog independently.

Cognitive

As the children grow they might develop interest in a specific type of animal which sparks natural desire to learn: it encourages them to read or research info about their pet on the Internet. Bringing a child to a veterinarian appointment can give him/her a chance to ask questions about the proper care or pet's health.


Pets as therapy

A hurting child might be more willing to initially trust a pet than a person. Since the relationship is non-judgmental from the pet's perspective, the special bond often develops between pet and child and thus pets can sometimes fill the role of comforter.

Decision making

Bringing a pet into the family is not a decision that should be made lightly. It first must be a commitment by the parents, not the child, as they will ultimately be responsible for the pet's welfare. Once that commitment has been made, however, and an appropriate pet has been found for the family, the joys and benefits of the pet relationship will last for many years to come 😊
