




STUPAVA RANCH








Vicente (Beavers): To be nice! My is Simon, we play catching games and monsters. And he gives me his toys to play.

Nelka (Butterflies): That you are friends with him or also with her. And that when they are sad you help them.










Lyla (Hamsters): friends means that you love each other and when they are sick they are still best friends.

ADVISORY

WHAT COULD PARENTS DO TO MAKE THE ADAPTATION

PROCESS OF THEIR CHILD EASIER?



Summer is over and we are ready for a new school year. Most of the kids are excited to come back to school but some of them are coming to the kindergarten for the very first time. It is never easy to come to a new place without knowing anyone and being away from the parents. No wonder our little ones might feel scared and insecure. But don't worry, we are here to help! Here are a few tips for you to make the adaptation process of your child easier. First of all, it is important to prepare the child in advance. Talk to your child about what to expect from the kindergarten focusing on positive



motivation. Tell them about new friends they are going to meet and all the things they are going to learn. Furthermore, it is necessary to keep the routine at home as well as in the kindergarten so your child has a sense of stability.

Arrange stable times of arrivals and departures. Come on time in the morning to minimize the potential stress and to have enough time to say proper goodbye in a positive atmosphere. Be on time when you come to pick them up as well. It is always better for you to wait for your child than the other way around. At home, make sure your child goes to bed early so he/she is properly rested. When kids are tired they are usually very moody. Always make sure that you keep your promise and never promise to your child something that you cannot fulfill. Kids have excellent memory and they remember all your promises and warnings. This will strengthen their trust and sense of security as they will know they can rely on you. It is also a good idea to set your own rituals. It can be something simple as special way of saying goodbye for instance, or rewarding sticker on the morning sticker



chart. On the other side, it is important that those rituals are as short as possible. To make the adaptation process easier, you can provide your child with a travelling toy, which represents something from home. Moreover, try not to stop your child when they start to cry. Allow them to feel their own emotion and confirm that it is alright to feel that way. Show them your appreciation for their effort instead and make sure that they know how proud you are of them. Do not hesitate to ask for help if you have any problem. Our experienced teachers will gladly help you and are ready to cooperate.
