

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HUMAN BODY EXPERIMENTS

Children in Mlynská Dolina campus, divided by classes, visited the checkpoints in which they learned about the functioning of a human body in a non-traditional and funny way. For example, at the "Heart & Blood" checkpoint children


could examine the composition of blood - red and white blood cells and blood platelets - and could create a model of blood in a jar in order to visualize it better. At the "Senses" checkpoint children were introduced to the function of each of the 5 senses (e.g. tasting an apple with covered eyes or recognizing the smell without looking, etc.). At the "Lungs & Breathing" checkpoint children exercised the capacity of their lungs and tried to blow off the prepared fine balls by exhaling carbon dioxide ©. At the last checkpoint called "Digestion" children worked with an artificial stomach (a glass bowl) and added all kinds of food into it, watching how it mixed up and how a digestive problem arose. Teachers explained to them why it is so important to eat healthy with adequate amounts of food. It was definitely one of the most exciting and creative workshops we have ever had in our Kindergarten and children enjoyed it very much ©.

OUR CLASS PROJECTS...

Healthy habits are important to keep our body fit. Washing hands, brushing teeth, eating well, sleeping enough that is what our **Seals** and **Narwhals** know and that is also why they got an important task – Ferko, the bear from the Seal class got sick and we had to help him get better and learn what to do to

fight bad germs next time. We talked about healthy habits, vitamins in fruit and vegetables, about the help we can get from a doctor and about the importance of exercise. We had a wonderful week full of movement and sport and a well-deserved rest afterwards! Our muscles grew and our bodies are in shape! Well done!

The Lions have discovered how the human body works! During the week "Human body factory" we dedicated each day to a different body system. All Monday we talked about the skeletal system: why we have bones and what they look like. Tuesday was all



about our muscles: why we need them and what we can do with them. On Wednesday we discussed what happens with the food in our body - we discovered our digestive system and its parts! Thursday was dedicated to the nervous system: how important our brain is and how it sends messages to all our body. Moreover, we did puzzle for each of our systems so at the end of the week we had big human body puzzle poster!
